Road Dahl (23 November 1990)

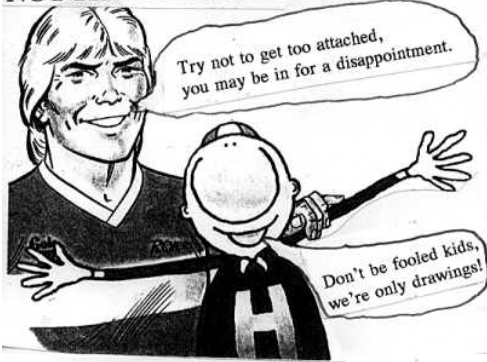
Writer of short, macabre and often perverted tales of self indulgence. Died unexpectedly.

Small market town which boasts an incredibly high ratio of Nick Cave lookalikes.

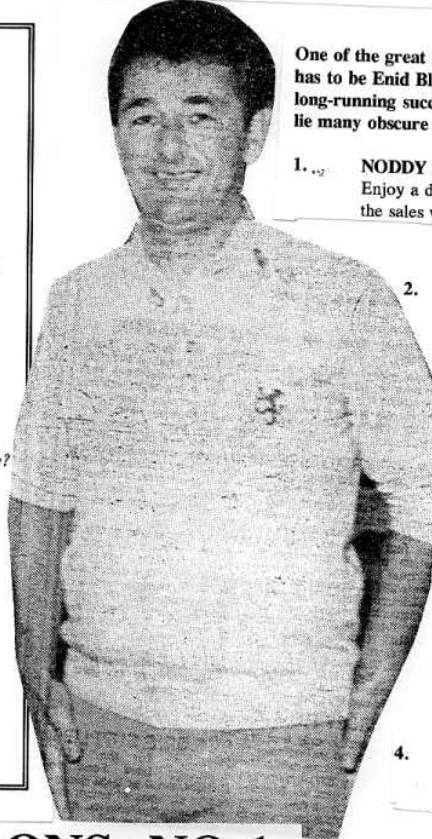
CLOUGHIES GREENHOUSE
